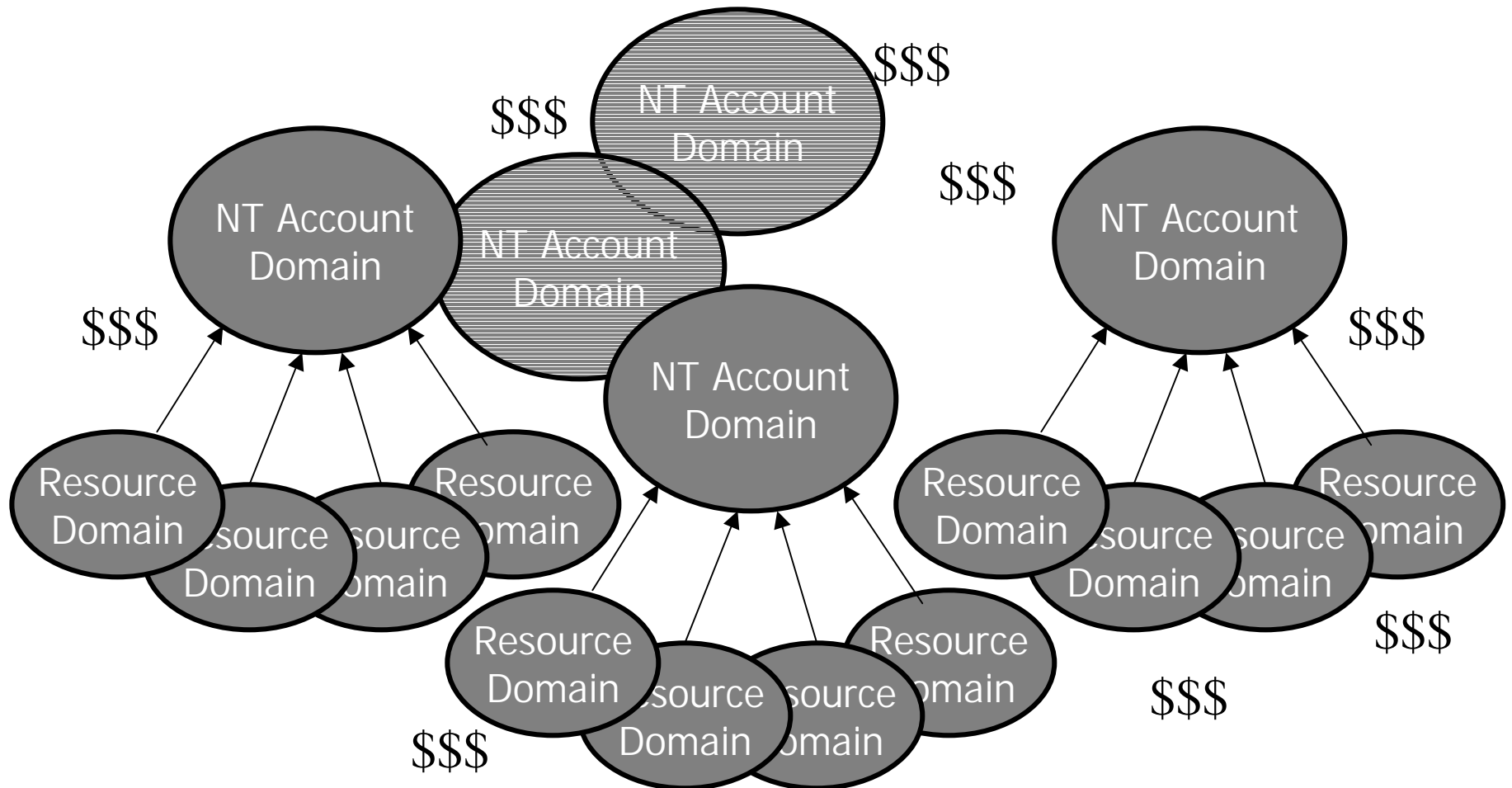

Unifying Administration

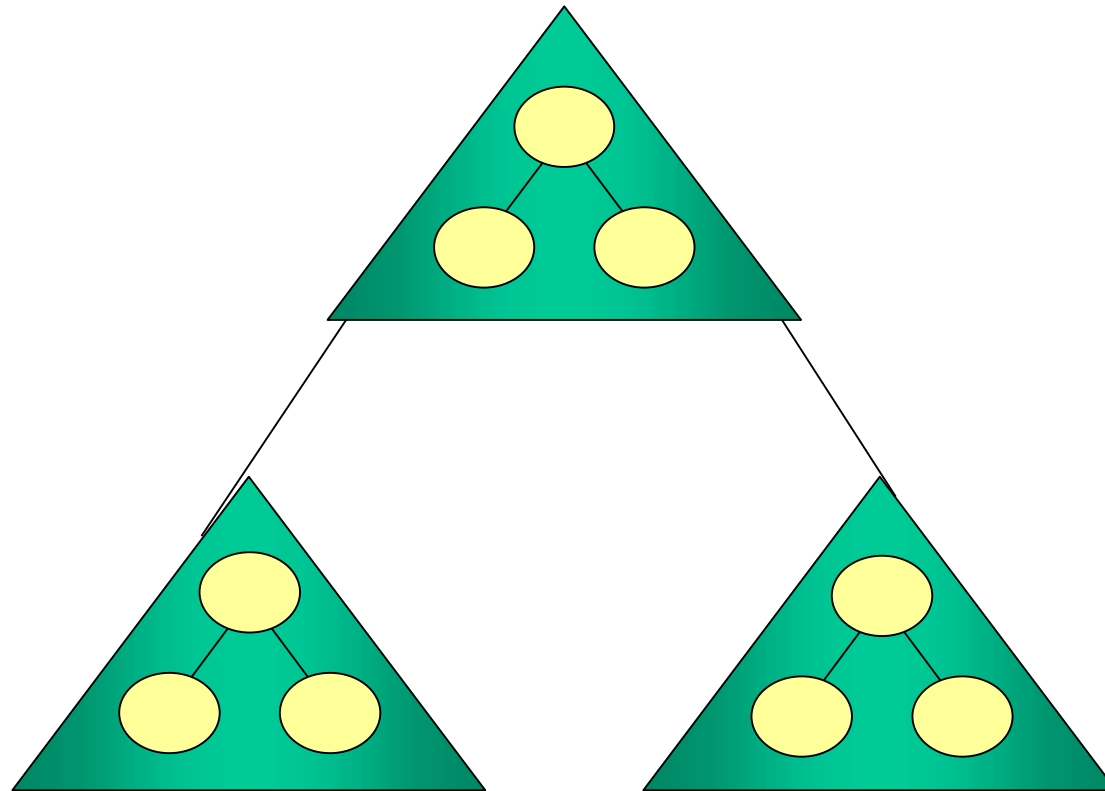
Windows NT 4.0 Source

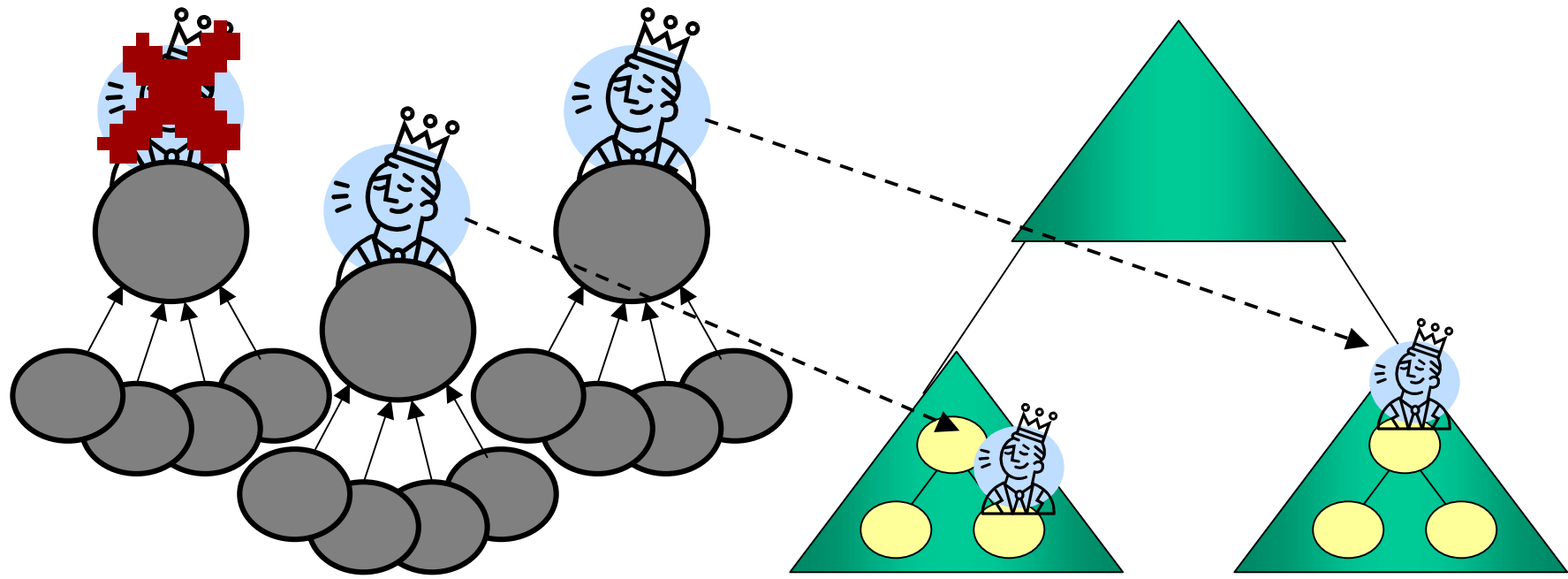

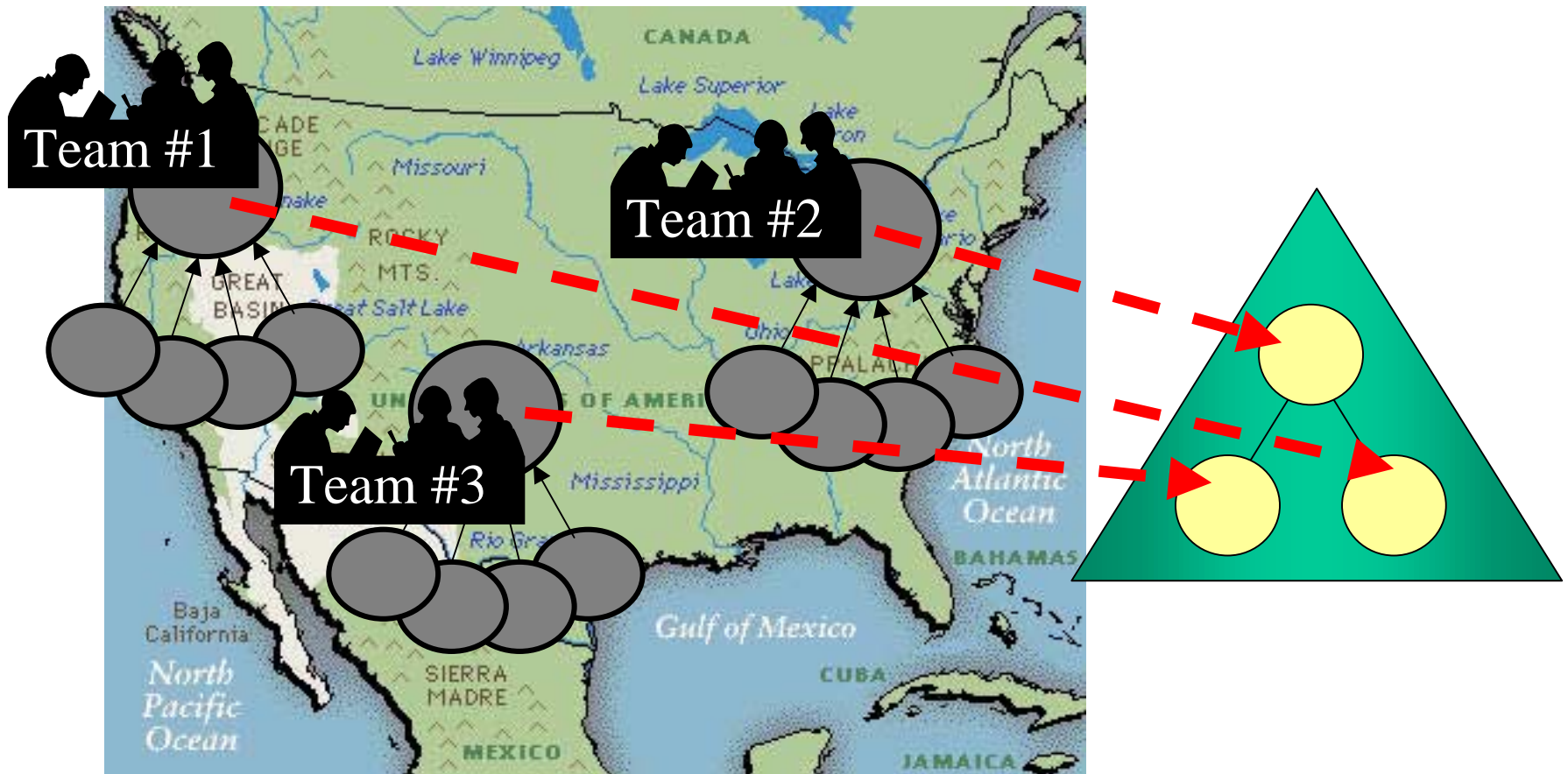
Non-Technical

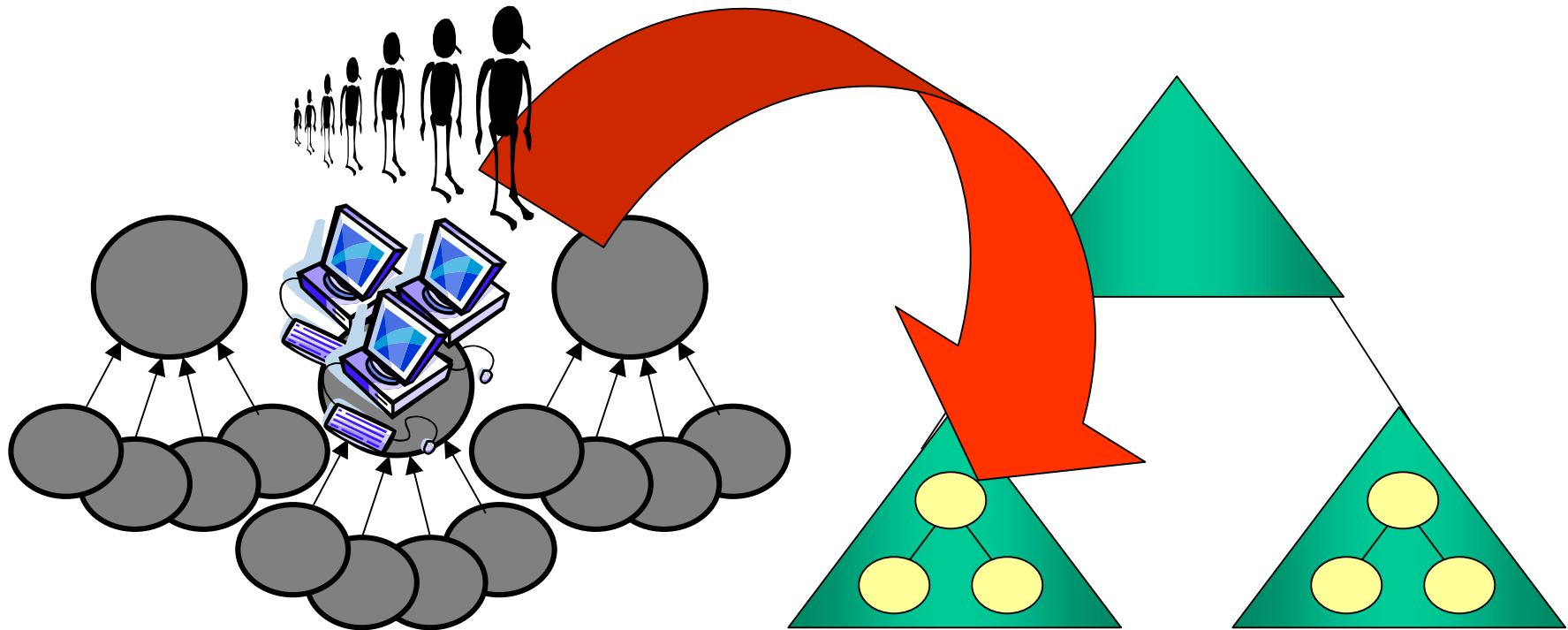

Different Worlds

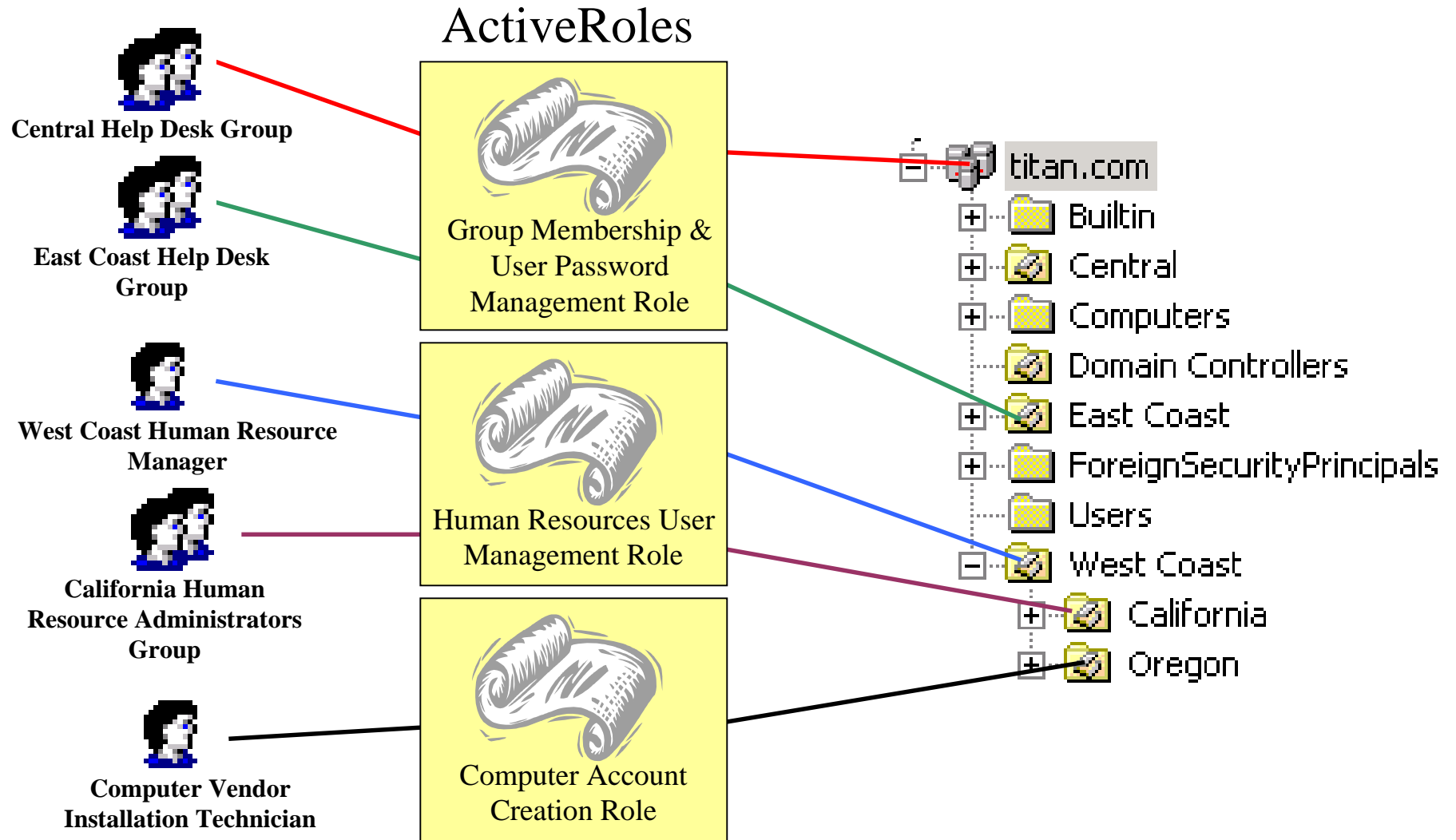
NT 4.0 Domains

- No granular delegation
- All or nothing administrative rights
- Many companies required 3rd party delegation infrastructures

Active Directory

- Extensive granularity of delegation
- Delegation model based on Access Control Lists for OUs and objects
- Delegation infrastructure is built into Active Directory

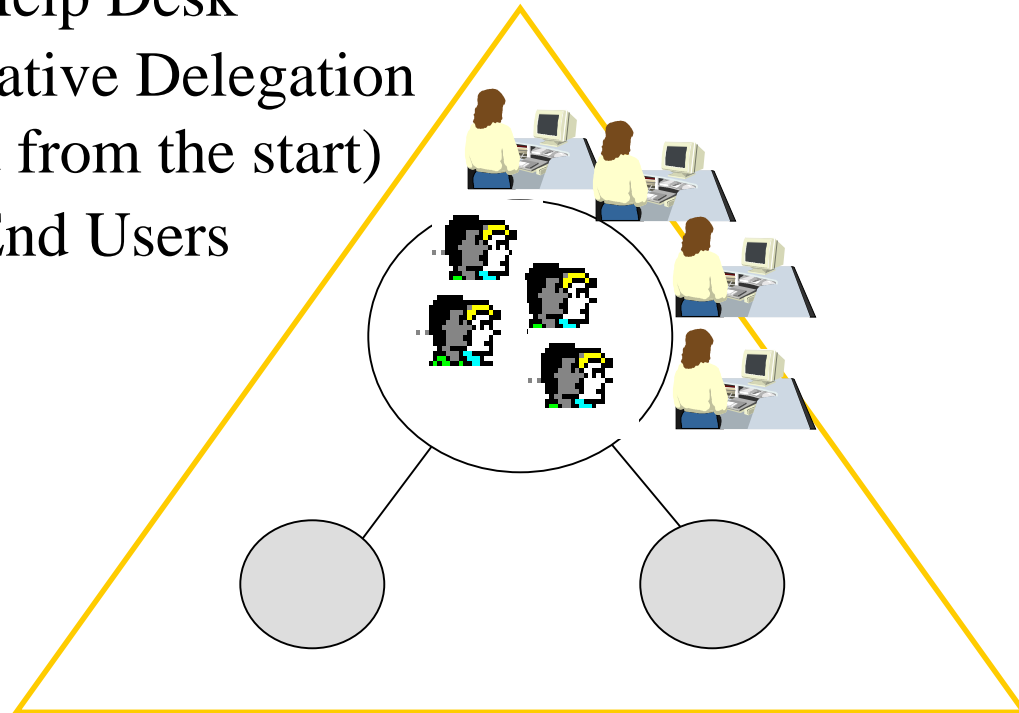
Managing Access to AD Data



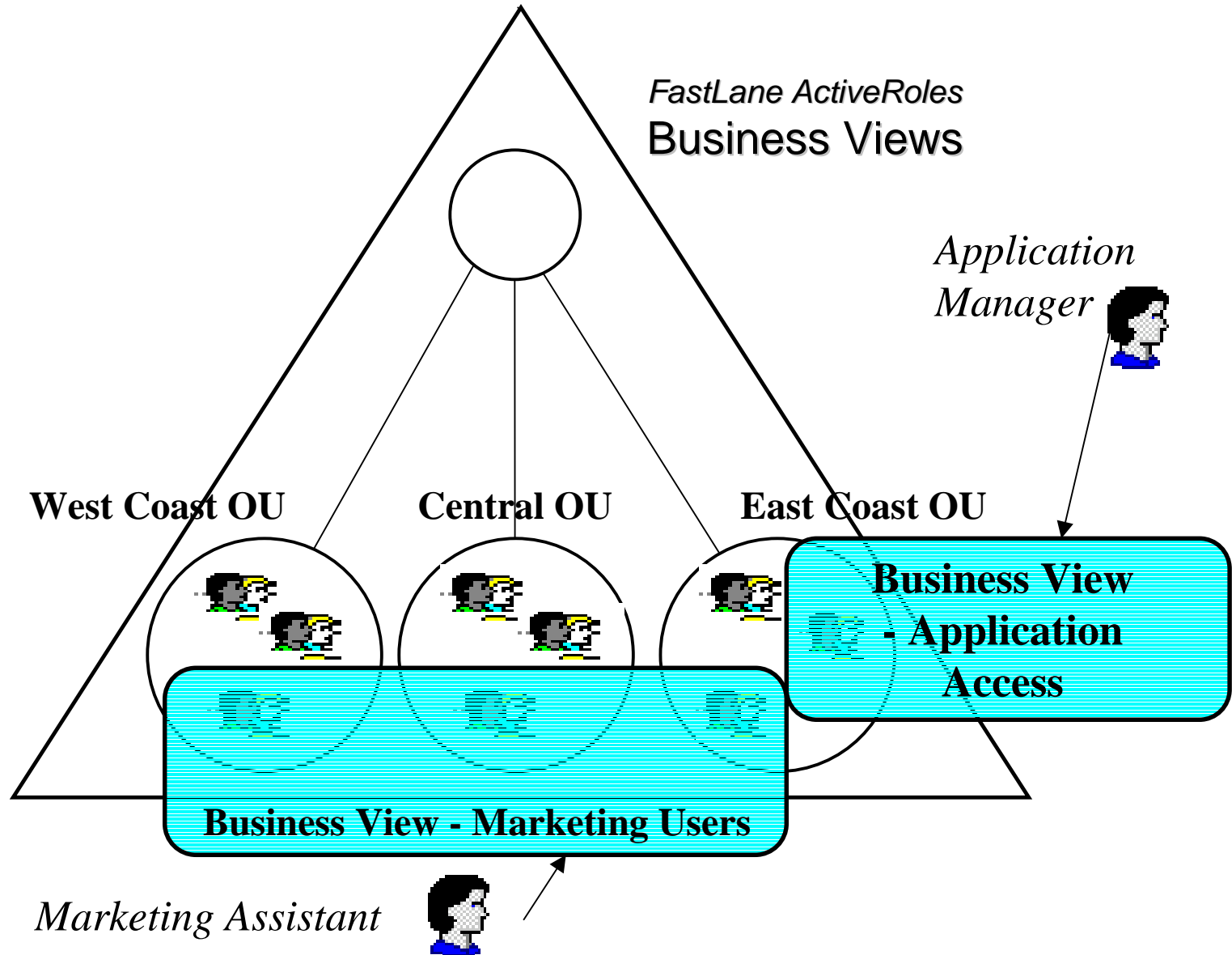
Role-Based Administration

Deploying Native Delegation in AD

1. Set-Up OUs
2. Migrate Help Desk
3. Deploy Native Delegation
(role-based from the start)
4. Migrate End Users



Making AD fit the Business



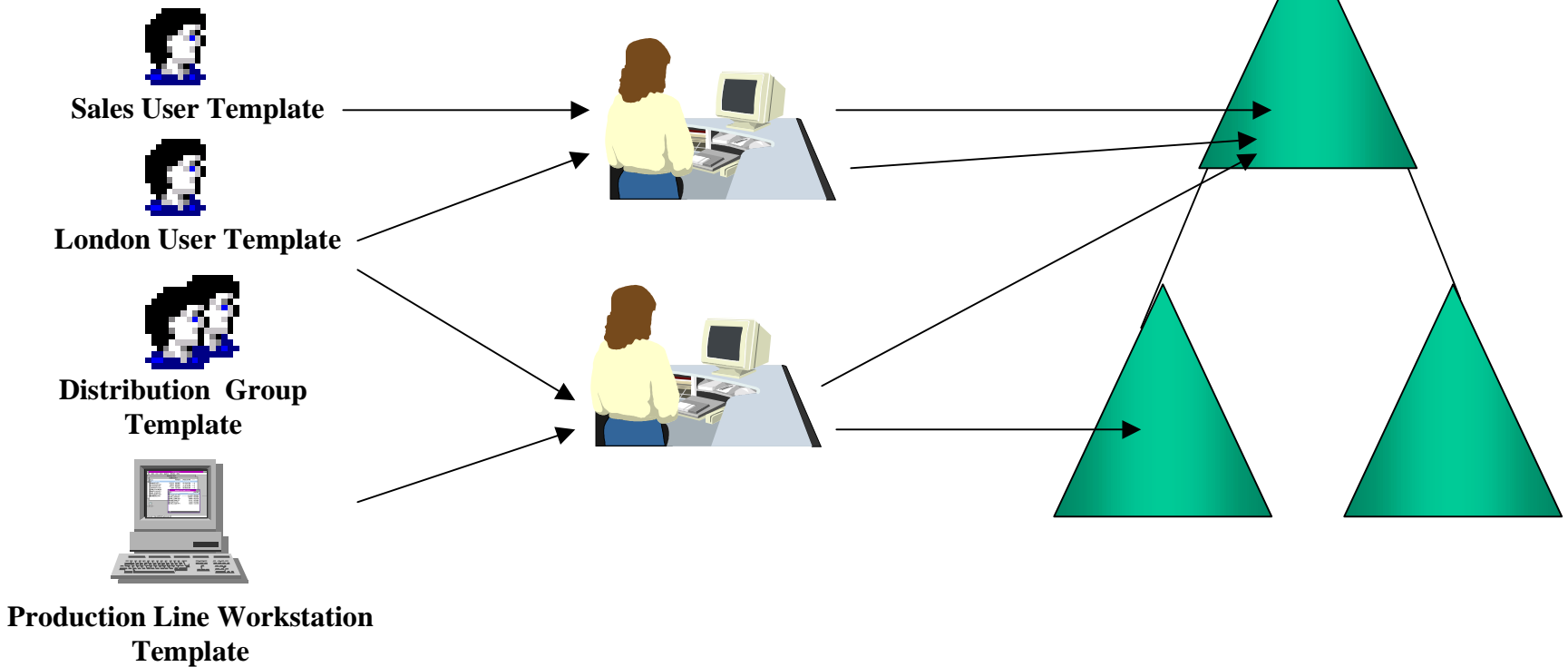
Eliminate Directory Pollution
